A hackathon-style event for Early Career Researchers of Topic 8

The event "Shaping the future of Georesources" will bring together early career researchers (ECRs, i.e. doctoral researchers and post-docs) from GFZ, GEOMAR, UFZ and RIFS working on "Georesource" themes including geothermal energy, geological storage, carbon and metal resources in both marine and terrestrial settings.

This social and interactive event gives ECRs the opportunity to engage with other ECRs in interdisciplinary teams, to work across center boundaries, to develop new ideas for real-life challenges, and to initiate future collaborations in a fun and productive environment. Good food and loads of coffee are also provided.

Topic 8: Georesources addresses some of the most pressing questions of our societies:

- How do we enable the transition towards low-carbon energy sources?
- Where do we find the metals for the energy transition and what controls the behaviour and enrichment of metals in the Earth system?
- How do we store gases and nuclear waste in the underground in the most secure way?
- and many more

These questions are not only guiding our current research program, but will become even more relevant for future generations of (geo)scientists.

- Initiate future "Georesource" research ideas
- Connect your projects with the research program and objectives of a sustainable Geo-future
